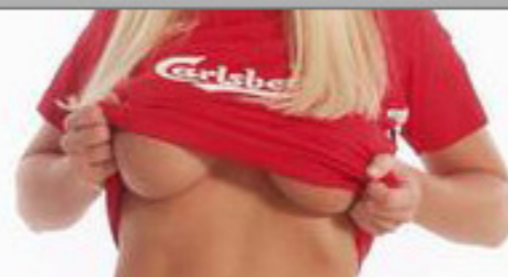

## F.C. BRITANICO 6 - 2 EMBUTIDOS LA NUNCIA
